ALBERT RAEISH.

Albert Raeish, an old and highly respected citizen, died at his residence on Fort street this morning, after an illness of about 10 days. Mr. Raeish was a native of Baden Baden, Germany, where he was born September 9th, 1821. He came to America in April, 1840, and located in Syracuse, where he was married in 1843 to Miss Mary Barbara Kartz. About thirty-two years ago he came to Auburn and established himself in the marble cutting business in the old Columbias block, on North street. Subsequently he had a shop on Genesee street then went to his late location on State street. He had seven children by his first wife, who died in June 1863, of which number, four daughters and a son are yet living. By a second wife, married in December, 1863, he had two children. Mr. Raeish has never filled any public office, but has been lacking in none of his duties to his family or his fellowmen. He was a member of the First Universalist church of this city, and was in good standing as a member of St. Paul's Lodge, F. and A. M., and Salem Town Commandery of Knight Templars. Twenty of his thirty-two years in Auburn, were spent in his late residence on Fort street, and his neighbors there will miss a familiar face and form. The funeral will be conducted by St Paul's Lodge, with Salem Town Commandery acting as an escort.
