DEATHS.

In Warsaw, March 20th, Br. PAUL RAYMOND, aged 33 years. During his sickness, which was lingering and painful, he manifested patience and fortitude becoming a Christian. Though he had been a believer in the final restitution but a short time, yet his faith was firm and unshaken. During the many interviews he had with his friends (both Universalists and Limitarians,) he testified his unwavering confidence in the ultimate purity and happiness of all mankind; and only regretted that he could not talk to them more of the great salvation. But notwithstanding this, reports were in circulation during his sickness, that he had renounced his faith. They were wholly unfounded; and by his request, were corrected at his funeral. Br. R. was a truly good man, a kind husband and father, and a worthy citizen.

His funeral was attended on the 22d, and the consolations of truth tendered to the mourning relatives and sympathising friends, by the writer.
