MRS JENNIE REDDICK, 63, PASSES AWAY AT THE CITY HOSPITAL

Mrs. Jennie Elizabeth Reddick, aged 63 years, of No. 333 West Lynde street, for many years a resident of this city, died at the House of the Good Samaritan on Wednesday evening at 11:20 o'clock. She had been in ill health for some time and on March 4 was brought to the hospital suffering from Bright's disease. She later suffered a stroke which was the immediate cause of her death on Monday.

Mrs. Reddick was born in Black River, March 27, 1861, the daughter of the late Al and Ellen Johnson McBride. For the first few years of her life she resided in Black River, later coming to this city with her parents. Many years ago she was married, later receiving a divorce. For many years Mrs. Reddick had resided in her West Lynde street residence alone.

She was well known as a resident of the North Side of this city. She was a regular attendant and member of All Souls' Universalist church.

Surviving are: one brother, C. M. McBride of Syracuse, two nephews, Arthur McBride of Syracuse and Floyd McBride of Skaneateles, and two nieces, Mrs. A. E. Lamon of Buffalo and Mrs. Floyd Cerwilliger of Linco [?], N. Y.

The remains were removed to the Burns Funeral Home in Benedict street and funeral services will be held from that place on Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock, Rev. Harry W. [Westbrook] Reed, pastor of All Souls' Universalist church, officiating. Burial will be made in the family plot in the Copenhagen cemetery.
