Ex-Assessor Kills Self

Little Falls—Henry Redmun, 76, of Little Falls, RD 3, former assessor for the Town of Danube for 20 years, was found dead in his home yesterday morning.

Herkimer County Coroner Gilbert Upright gave a ruling of suicide. He said Mr. Redmun shot himself in the mouth with a 38 caliber revolver.

Mr. Redmun was found about 11:50 a.m. by August Gloskey, a neighbor, who investigated after efforts by relatives to contact him had failed. Mr. Redmun had been in ill health, reported Troopers John George and Donald Pearson, BCI.

Mr. Redmun was born in Little Falls. He married Elizabeth Casler in 1915. The couple purchased a farm on Forest Bush Road, Town of Danube. Mr. Redmun operated the farm until he retired in 1960. His wife died in 1957.

He was a member of St. Paul's Universalist Church, Little Falls, and the Farm Bureau of Herkimer County.

He leaves several nieces, nephews and cousins.

The funeral will be at 2 Saturday from the Newitt-Bly Funeral Home with the Rev. Robert W. Sterling, pastor of St. Paul's Universalist Church officiating. Burial will be in Church Street Cemetery.

Calling hours are from 7 to 9 tonight, 2 to 4 and 7 to 9 tomorrow and until the funeral.
