Death of George M. Reed

George M. Reed, the accountant at E. D. Parker & Co.'s, died at the residence of his father, Silas W. Reed, 67 North street, last night. Mr. Reed was a well-known and popular young man, kind, courteous and gentlemanly. He had a host of friends who will mourn his untimely demise. Mr. Reed was a member of the Auburn Gun club, and his death is the first that has occurred since the organization of the club. At a meeting last night the club decided to postpone the shoot which was to have taken place between teams of the Auburn and Syracuse clubs to-morrow, and appointed a committee on flowers.
