C. R. Richardson, Retired Mortician, Leading Mason, Dies

MIDDLEPORT—A former funeral director here, Charles R. Richardson, 89, died this morning (Oct. 7, 1960) in Medina Memorial Hospital. He had been a patient there for 10 days.

Mr. Richardson was born April 23, 1871, in the Town of Royalton, and had resided in this vicinity all his life. He was the first president of the Niagara County Funeral Directors' Assn. and was a funeral director here from 1900 to Jan. 1, 1946 when he retired.

He was also a charter member of the Middleport Savings & Loan Association and had been its treasurer since 1922. Mr. Richardson attended [and was a member of] the First Universalist Church.

Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Florence Garland Richardson; two grandchildren, [Mrs. Theodore Schoonover and John Pickett], both of Albion; and four great-grandchildren. His only daughter, Mrs. Gladys Pickett, died about 30 years ago.
