GEORGE W. RICHMOND

Well Known Resident Died at His Home in This Village Tuesday Morning

George W. Richmond, a well known resident of this place, a veteran of the Civil War, and for some time a merchant in this village, died at his home on West Main street last Tuesday morning, March 25, 1913, at the age of 74 years. Mr. Richmond, while in the Civil War was a prisoner at Andersonville prison for eight months, and he had been in poor health ever since. For the past five years he had been quite feeble.

Mr. Richmond was born in 1839 in this township. His whole life, except the time spent in the war, was passed here. On Feb. 11, 1865, he married Ella May Ketchum in Yates County, N.Y., who survives him. He is also survived by three sons, Mason and Harvey S. of this place, and Frank of Groveland, one daughter, Inez, who lives at home, one brother, Henry Richmond of this place, and other relatives, besides a host of friends.

Mr. Richmond was a kind father and husband, a good citizen, and a consistent and faithful member of the Universalist church. He was also a member of Sawyer Post, G.A.R.

The funeral was held this afternoon at two o'clock from the Universalist church, Rev. J. [James] D. Herrick officiating. Burial was in Rural cemetery.
