H.S. RICHMOND, BUSINESSMAN, DEAD

Had Been in General Merchandise Business for the Past Twenty-one Years—
Died Suddenly, Saturday Morning

Harvey S. Richmond, aged 49 years, a son of the late George and Ella Ketcham Richmond, died suddenly at his home in this village, at 3 o'clock, Saturday morning, February 12, 1927 of heart disease. He had been in poor health for the past four years but had been about his business as usual except while he had an attack of measles some three weeks ago and since when he had not seemed to regain his strength. He had been at the store as usual Friday all day, going home late in the evening. Mrs. Richmond discovered him in a state of coma and all attempts to arouse him failed and he died before a doctor could arrive.

Mr. Richmond had been in business in this village for some twenty-one years and had been very successful. He was married to Miss Kate Neal in Whitesville in 1901 and besides the widow is survived by one son Everett and three grandchildren, as well as one brother, Frank of Rochester and a sister, Miss Inez Richmond of this village.

Deceased had been for years a member of the local Universalist Church, being active as Superintendent of the Bible School and was at the time of his passing, President of the Board of Trustees.

The funeral was held from the home in Park Avenue, Monday afternoon, February 14, 1927 at 2 o'clock and interment was in the family plot in Rural cemetery, Rev. R. S. Kellerman of the Universalist Church and Rev. L. J. Engler of the Methodist Church, officiating.
