MISS CATHERINE ROBBINS DIED IN WINCHESTER, MASS.

Miss Catherine Louise Robbins died in Winchester, Mass., on April 26, 1912. She was the daughter of Frederick A. and Catherine Whittlesey Robbins, of Angelica, N.Y., and is survived by her sister Ellen S. Robbins, of Winchester, and her brothers, Fred A. Robbins, of Hornell, N.Y., and Hayes Robbins, of Winchester. Miss Robbins was for a number of years a resident of Mount Vernon, assisting in her sister's kindergarten in Willard hall, and in the office of the Institute of Social Economics, New York. Some years later she taught a difficult mission school in western Virginia, with exceptional success, and afterwards gave several interesting lectures on the work among the mountain people. She was an active worker in the Universalist church of Mount Vernon, and throughout her life indispensably helpful in all the home relations. Never in robust health and rarely free from pain, her brave, sunny nature endeared her to a wide circle of friends and brightened the lives of all who came to know her. Funeral services were held at the home of her sister on April 29, and the burial was in Wildwood cemetery, Winchester.
