Mrs. Cynthia Korleen Adams Roberts, wife of Charles D. Roberts of Buffalo, died in her home on February 25 after a protracted illness. They began their married life in Buffalo where Mr. Roberts has been employed in the advertising department of Pratt & Lambert, Inc.

Mrs. Roberts served for twelve years as recording secretary of the Women's Aid Society of the First Universalist Church in Buffalo and was always an active and loyal member of this church. She is survived by her husband and several nephews. The Funeral service was conducted in the Buffalo Cremation Chapel on February 28 by the Rev. Robert E. Davis, pastor of the Universalist Church in Buffalo.
