MRS. CELESTIA HOWLETT ROBINSON

Mrs. Celestia Howlett Robinson, one of the oldest woman residents of the West End, died yesterday at the home of her son, Lewis T. Robinson of 306 Hamilton-st. after a long illness. Mrs. Robinson had been totally blind since 1897.

She was born in 1823 at Howlett Hill, N, Y., and was the eighth of 11 children of the Howlett family, of which there is now left but one, Alfred Howlett of this city. In 1841 she married Thomas Robinson and they moved to the West End in 1849. Her husband died 11 years ago [in 1886, per his death notice].

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. E. R. Von Frankenberg of New York, and two sons, H. E. Robinson of Buffalo and L. T. Robinson of this city, and one brother, Alfred Howlett. Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. to-morrow at the home of L. T. Robinson in Hamilton-st. The Rev. F. W. Betts, pastor of the First Universalist church, will officiate. Burial will be in Howlett Hill cemetery, near Camillus.
