MISS FRANC [sic] ROBINSON

The funeral of Miss Frances C. Robinson, whose death occurred at the Castile Sanitarium on Tuesday afternoon of last week, was held at her late home on North Main street [in Castile], where she has lived for a number of years. Rev. Clara Morgan (pastor of the First Universalist Church of Perry, of which Miss Robinson was a member) officiated. The burial was in Perry. Miss Robinson was one of the best known residents of the Town of Castile, having lived on the Lower Reservation since she came from Scipio with her father, John Robinson, in 1850, until his death in 1890, when she came to live with her nieces, Mrs. Alexander M. Armour and Miss Luella M. Taber, and later moved into this village. She was born in Scipio and was the youngest of three children, the others being Mrs. Frank M. Taber and John E. Robinson, both deceased. The nearest surviving relatives are her nieces, who live in Castile, and a nephew, Fred B. Robinson of Rochester.

Franc E. Robinson was born at Scipio, N.Y., Sept. 26, 1844, the daughter of John and Mary Robinson. She died at the sanitarium at Castile, N.Y., June 20, 1922, after a severe illness of two months.

Her nearest relatives still living are a nephew, Fred B. Robinson at Rochester, and two nieces, Mrs. A. M. Armour and Mrs. Luella M. Taber of Castile.
