Obituary.

On Sunday afternoon, July 9th, occurred the death of Frank M. Robinson, at his home on Leatherstocking street in this village. Mr. Robinson came to this country from Sauquoit, Oneida county, about thirty years ago. For a few years he was engaged in farming, at one time having charge of the Judge Nelson farm. Later he went into the boot and shoe business in the store now occupied by Fenn & Thayer's pharmacy. After continuing here for some time he went into the hardware business in the building now occupied by the Boston Clothing House. For the last twelve years, however, he has been a sufferer from rheumatism to such an extent as to make it necessary for him to retire from active business life. Mr. Robinson was nearly sixty-six years of age, his birthday coming on the 19th of July. He was a member of the Universalist church, and had several times been elected to offices of public trust by his townsmen. Besides a sorrowing widow he leaves one daughter, Mrs. E. P. Chapman, of New York. The funeral services took place at the house, Wednesday afternoon, the Rev. Mr. Fisher officiating.
