Henry Robinson Dies in Chicago

Bridgewater, May 19.—Word has been received here of the death in Chicago of Henry Robinson, a well-known resident of this village. He was 80 years old. Mr. Robinson had been spending the winter with his daughter, Mrs. Mary R. Bryant and his death occurred Saturday at his home. The body arrived here today and the funeral will be held tomorrow at Maple Dell, the Robinson home. Mr. Robinson was a veteran of the Civil War and at one time was postmaster of his village. He was also prominent in Masonic circles.

Surviving are his widow, who was Miss [Sarah] Brockway of this village, his daughter in Chicago and a son, Harry Lynn Robinson of Crestwood, N.Y.
