MRS. SARAH ROBINSON DIES AT DAUGHTER'S HOME IN CHICAGO

[On] Thursday night at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Burton Bryant in Chicago, occurred the death of Mrs. Sarah Robinson after an illness of several months.

Sarah Brockway was the daughter of Albert and Phoebe Brockway and was born at Mapledale, April 29, 1841. Her early girlhood was spent here. She attended school in Syracuse and spent several years there with an aunt. [On] July 20, 1866, she married Henry Robinson and for many years they lived in the old homestead at Mapledale.

In 1918 Mr. and Mrs. Robinson gave up their home here and went to Chicago to live with her daughter. Mr. Robinson died the next year [in 1920].

Mrs. Robinson was a member of the Woman's Art Club and Kismet Chapter, O.E.S. Her funeral was held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the home of her grandson, Robert L. Bryant, Rev. DeWitt Lamphear, pastor of the Universalist church officiating. Interment was at Fairview cemetery where the committal service was in charge of Kismet Chapter, O.E.S.

She is survived by two children, Mrs. Burton Bryant of Chicago and Lynn Robinson of New York and two grand children, Miss Loma Bryant of Chicago and Robert L. Bryant of Bridgewater.
