Mrs. Sarah A. Robinson

Sarah A. Brown, widow of Samuel M. Robinson, died at her home in South Oxford Wednesday morning. Her illness was of short duration and she had been confined to her bed only since Saturday. Mrs. Robinson was 81 years of age last May. She was born in South New Berlin and was a daughter of Thomas and Nancy Brown. Her parents lived for a time in South Oxford and then moved back to the town of New Berlin. She was married there, Feb. 22, 1848, to Samuel M. Robinson and South Oxford was thenceforth her home. Her husband's family had long been prominent in that part of the country and he was a direct descendant of John R. Robinson, a clergyman, who came to America with the Pilgrims. Mrs. Robinson was a member of the Universalist church of Oxford. She possessed traits of character which endeared her to many friends and her death will be sincerely mourned. Her husband died Dec. 15, 1896. Of five children but one is living, Mrs. Mary J. Tremaine of Greene. She also leaves an adopted son, W. Archie Robinson of South Oxford, a granddaughter, Mrs. Frances M. Wells of Utica, and a grandson, John Robinson Hitchcock of Oxford. The funeral was held from the home of the deceased this forenoon at 11 o'clock, Rev. O. R. Beardsley of Oxford officiating. -*Oxford Press*.
