Mrs. Mina Hodge Rogers

Mrs. Mina Hodge Rogers, aged 68 years and 10 months, widow of Chas. O. Rogers, died at her home in Church street, Adams Center, at 9:30 Wednesday evening, April 29th, of pernicious anæmia. She had been in poor health for about two years and had been ill for about a month.

She was the daughter of Rodney and Charlotte Munson Hodge and was born in the town of Pinckney, Lewis county, June 28, 1858. Of their family of seven children, three survive her. When she was a child her parents purchased a farm near Adams Center and came here to reside. She was married to Charles O. Rogers, of Watertown, Oct. 21, 1879 and, with the exception of two years which they spent in Sodus, she has continued to live in Adams Center. For several years they lived on a farm near here and about ten years ago, they moved to her home in Church street. Mr. Rogers died April 21, 1923.

She was a member of the Adams Center Grange, of the Ladies' Auxiliary, of the Pastime Club and of the Birthday Club and has been active in the work of these organizations.

She is survived by two brothers, James M. Hodge of Adams Center; and Jay N. Hodge of Rome; one sister, Mrs. Emma Leonard of Worchester [Westchester??], N.Y.; an adopted daughter, Mrs. Lona Bradbury of Mallory and by two nephews, J. Rodney Hodge of Adams Center and Robert Hodge of Rome.

Funeral services were conducted at her home at 2:30, Saturday afternoon. Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist church officiated and interment was made in Union cemetery.
