PAUL ROWLEY DIES AT 61, WAS INSURANCE BROKER

Funeral services for Paul Rowley, 61, insurance broker, of 289 Stratford Road, who died yesterday at the Caledonian Hospital, will be held at 2:30 p.m. tomorrow in the Fairchild Chapel, 86 Lefferts Place. Burial will be in Green-wood Cemetery.

Mr. Rowley was a leading member of All Souls Universalist Church, and the pastor, the Rev. Cornelius Greenway, will officiate at the services. Mr. Rowley had been a member of the board of trustees of the church for many years and was a member of the advisory board at his death.
