JOHN W. RUEFER 63, DIES; WAS JEWELER

John W. Ruefer, 63, a well-known figure in the jewelry trade for many years and formerly a partner in the old firm of Ludwig Nissen & Co., died today at his home, 560 E. 17th St., of a cerebral hemorrhage. He had been ill several days.
