OBITUARY.—Mrs. Emory [Mary Emily] Rundle died at her residence here, on Monday afternoon last, Feb. 23rd, after a painful sickness of one week of pleura-pneumonia, in her 49th year. A few days ago she was in attendance at her sister-in-law's (Mrs. B. R. Lobdell) who was very ill. She was taken with a violent chill and was hardly able to ride to her home, a short distance away. Medical aid was at once summoned and everything possible was done in order to relieve her of her intense sufferings. [On] Friday night Dr. Potter, of Purdys, was called in consultation with Dr. Miller, of Brewster, who had the case in hand. Both agreed that it was almost a hopeless case, but on Monday morning there was a slight hope of her recovery, but it was soon dashed away by signs of her nearness unto death. Her mind was clear to the last. Deceased was loved by all who knew her. She was an excellent worker in church matters, and in everything pertaining to charity. None saw her but to love her, none knew her but to praise. She was the highest type of womanhood, both at home and abroad. The news of her death cast a gloom over the whole community. The sympathy of all is extended to the entire family. May God bless them and comfort them in this, their heavy affliction. The funeral was largely attended on Thursday (yesterday). Rev. T. S. Lathrop of the Universalist Church, preached the funeral sermon. Interment at Salem Centre.
