Mrs. Alice J. Salisbury, seventy, of Rochestser, widow of Journal E. Salisbury, and grandmother of Mrs. Leo F. Decker and Stanley P. Salisbury of Batavia, died at 9:30 o'clock Saturday night (December 16, 1939) at St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester, where she had been a patient for two weeks, following a cerebral hemorrhage.

Mrs. Salisbury was born at Barre, Orleans County, on May 17, 1869, a daughter of the late William and Der Freuhling Thompson Luttenton. Mr. Salisbury, who died on April 19, 1931 [gravestone reads 1930], was Orleans County welfare commissioner for nine years. She spent all her life at Albion and Barre, except for a few years in Virginia and the past nine years in Rochester, where she made her home with her son, Keene L. Salisbury.

Besides her son and two grandchildren, Mrs. Salisbury is survived by a sister, Miss Cora V. Luttenton, and two brothers, William J. and Homer W. Luttenton, all of Albion.

Funeral services for Mrs. Salisbury will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock from McNall's Funeral Home, Albion, the Rev. L. [Lewis] H. Robinson of Albion officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Albion cemetery.
