Kilby and James Brownell for three years; and C. P. McDonald secretary and treasurer. The lady members of the congregation have organized a society to be known as the Susan B. Branaugh Aid Society of the Carthage Universalist church and selected the following officers: President, Mrs. Lalor [Rosalee] Sarvay; vice president, Mrs. Ed. Aldrich; secretary and treasurer, Mrs. Guy Penniman. It is hoped by the members and friends of the society that another summer may witness the erection of a handsome little church edifice on the site recently purchased by the society on School street.

LALOR SARVEY [,] BUSINESS MAN [,] PASSES AWAY

Lalor Sarvey, 64, for many years a prominent business man of this village, died this morning at 9:30 o'clock at his home in North Washington street after a long illness.

Mr. Sarvey was born in the town of Wilna, February 19, 1962, a son of Leonard and Laura Sarvey, and followed farming until 23 years ago when he came to this village. He first became associated with the McDonald Milling Company and later went into business for himself, known as the Stoddard-Sarvey Company. Later he dissolved partnership and became associated with the Jefferson Chair Company until his retirement from active business life.

He was a member of the Carthage Lodge, I.O.O.F., of the Grange, and attended the United Christian church.¹

Besides his wife, Rosalie, he is survived by one son, D. W. Sarvey of Carthage; two daughters, Mrs. S. E. Haynes of Wilson, and Mrs. Clark Perry of Rockport, and by two brothers, Merton of Cortland and Orlin of Wilna.
