JESSE SAWIN, RESIDENT OF WINTHROP, DIES

WINTHROP—Jesse P. Sawin, 88, passed away in his Main Street home here Monday afternoon about 5.

Rev. H. P. [Herbert Philbrook] Morrell of Canton will conduct the funeral service at 2 p.m. today in the Universalist Church. Interment will be in Winthrop Cemetery.

The son of Philander and Esther Thompson Sawin, he was born April 25, 1845, on Main Street, Potsdam. His father died when he was two years old. His mother afterwards married A. H. Andrews of Massena and Jesse lived with his grandfather and uncle, Anthony and John Thompson, on their farm near Southville until he was 24 and married Anna Davis.

They lived on a farm near West Stockholm and had one son, Riley, who died when nine years old. Mrs. Sawin died in 1874 and in 1876 he married Lois Munson and bought the Henry Munson farm near Winthrop where they lived until 1889 when they moved into town. They united with the Universalist Church and Mr. Sawin was a charter member of Odd Fellows and Winthrop Grange.

His second wife died Jan. 9, 1917, and on Nov. 28, 1917 he and Mrs. Carrie Richardson of Winthrop [widow of Luman] were married by Rev. Clarence Cowing of Central Square.

He is survived by his wife, two nephews, Elmer Waite of Southville and Jesse Waite of Auburn, and a stepson, Carl Richardson, of Winthrop.
