MISS SCHNEIDER DIES, AGE 86

Dexter, April 22—Miss Laura A. Schneider, 86, retired school teacher, died Tuesday afternoon at 3 at the home of her sisters in Orange, Mass. She had been in failing health for some time. Death was due to the infirmities of old age.

Miss Schneider was born in Orange, Mass., daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Schneider, and came to this village with her parents when she was a young woman. For many years she taught in the district schools near here, later going to Watertown where she taught in Boon and Arsenal street schools. More than 50 years ago she left the Watertown schools.

After the death of her parents she made her home in this village. For the past years she had been quite feeble and last fall her sisters took her with them to Orange, Mass.

Surviving are her twin sisters, Mrs. Florence T. Bliss and Mrs. Frank Speer, and two nieces, Mrs. Charles Rogers and Mrs. Melvin Whitney, all of Orange, Mass.

The remains will arrive in Watertown Friday morning and funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at 2 from the Universalist church, of which she was a member. Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, D.D., [the minister] will officiate. Burial will be made in Dexter cemetery.
