GILES F. SCOTT

Giles F. Scott, 81, died Nov. 17, 1952, in Utica Memorial Hospital. He had been in failing health for some time.

Mr. Scott was born in 1871 in Brookfield, a son of Lorin and Clara Ferrin Scott. His ancestors were early settlers of this area, 16 of them having served with the Continental Army in the Revolutionary War.

He was educated in local schools and in the Clinton Liberal Institute, Fort Plain. As a boy he was a baseball player, and maintained an interest in that game throughout his life. He was a member of the Universalist Church of Bridgewater.

A dairy farmer, Mr. Scott was a keen judge of cattle, and had maintained excellent herds at his farm on Route 8. He was a member of Madison County Holstein Club, and had been a member of the Holstein-Friesian Association for 50 years.

He married the former Harriet Palmer in 1905. Mrs. Scott died Dec. 31, 1905 [should be 1919].

Mr. Scott leaves two daughters, Mrs. Leon Roberts, Bridgewater, and Mrs. Earl Hubbell, Frankfort; and three sons, Palmer, Willard and Hosmer Scott, all of Bridgewater; four brothers, Fred and Charles Scott, both of Bridgewater, Irving Scott of Hamilton, and Earl Scott of Sarasota, Fla.; and four grandchildren.

The funeral was held at 2 p.m. today from the Wilcox funeral home, West Winfield, with burial in the Universalist Cemetery, Bridgewater.
