DEATHS.

In Ellisburg, by suicide, on the 17th of July, Mrs. LYDIA SCOTT, consort of Jonathan E. Scott,¹ and daughter of Mr. Newell Howe, of Sandy Creek, in the 25th year of her age, leaving four small children without a mother, and many sincere friends to lament the dark providence by which she was removed to her "long home." The deceased possessed all those virtues and performed all those duties which render domestic life happy; but in the dreary season of disease, her reason manifestly departed, and she died by her own hands. Her funeral was attended on the 18th, at the Baptist church in Woodville, by a numerous and deeply affected auditory, when the writer of this notice endeavored to explain the principles of divine government, and administer the unfailing consolations of the Gospel of Christ.
