MRS. SCRIPTER DIES, AGE 72
Rensselaer Falls Woman Was Ill Two Weeks
WELL KNOWN IN VILLAGE
Funeral Services Will Be Held From Late Home
Friday Afternoon at 2, Rev. Darrel J. Westlake Officiating

Rensselaer Falls, May 21.—Mrs. Carrie L. Scripter, widow of the late Homer Scripter, died at her home Wednesday morning at 10:15, following an illness of two weeks, aged 72 years.

Mrs. Scripter had spent the past two winters in Lisbon with her daughter, Mrs. William Bulson. Last winter she suffered a severe illness and for several weeks was in critical condition. She recovered, however, and about Easter time returned to her home in this village. At her bedside during her late illness were her children and her friend, Mrs. Charlotte Morrison of Lisbon.

She was born in the town of Canton in 1853, the daughter of Erasmus and Sarah Ann Whitney. Many years ago she was married to Homer Scripter, who died many years ago. She lived on farms in the town of Canton, and for the past 33 years of her life had resided in Rensselaer Falls.

She is survived by three children, John V. Scripter of Hannibal, Mrs. William Bulson of Lisbon and Mrs. W. L. Perry of Rensselaer Falls; five grandchildren, Mrs. Leon Dawley, Miss Margaret Bulson and Walter Bulson of Lisbon, Eva Perry and Glenn Perry of this place. She also leaves three great-grandchildren. Levi E. Coy is a nephew and Mrs. Charlotte Morrison of Lisbon is a cousin and a life-long friend.

Mrs. Scripter was a member of [?] Chapter No. 324 O.E.S. and has served as one of its officers.

She was a regular attendant and faithful worker of the Congregational church. In faith she was a Universalist, as she had been reared. Mrs. Scripter was of the type of women who inspired the writing of the 31st chapter of Proverbs.

The funeral will be held from the home Friday afternoon at 2, Rev. Darrel J. Westlake of the Congregational church officiating. The bearers will be the son and other relatives, J. V. Scripter, William Bulson, Levi E. Coy and Frank Norton.

Interment will be made in the Rensselaer Falls cemetery. The Order of Eastern Star will participate in the service at the grave.
