Mourn a Good Citizen Little Falls Regrets the Death of George W. Shall

Little Falls, Oct. 30. (Special).—In the death of George W. Shall yesterday at New York, Little Falls lost a valuable and public spirited citizen. Mr. Shall went to New York last week to visit his son Frank, who is managing clerk in a large law office. [On] Saturday he attended the Yale-Columbia football game and that night was stricken with neuralgia of the heart. Some eminent specialists were consulted. They said the tubes going to Mr. Shall's heart were paralyzed and there was no hopes for his recovery. He died yesterday morning, but the announcement was not made in this city till late in the afternoon.

George W. Shall was 55 years of age. He was born and reared in the town of Danube, this county. He came to this city about forty years ago and has conducted a farmers' supply store on Albany street since. In politics he was a Democrat, holding at present a position of ward Committeeman. Mr. Shall was a member of the Board of Public Works and has been a valuable and conscientious official. He was a member of the Odd Fellows, in which organization he was prominent, being well known throughout the state. He is also an Elk and a director of the Little Falls National Bank. Genial and affable, George W. Shall made friends wherever he went. His death has caused sadness in the city. The remains arrived in this city last night at 10:04 and were taken to his home in Monroe street. The funeral will be held Thursday from the house at 1 o'clock and from the Universalist Church at 1:30.
