Fort Plain Man Expires Monday At Amsterdam
Guy Shaut Funeral Held Tomorrow at Gray Funeral Home

FORT PLAIN, July 23.—Funeral services for Guy Shaut, 80, who died Monday in the Bush Convalescent Home, Amsterdam, where he had been a patient for several months, will be held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon at the Gray funeral home, Fort Plain. The Rev. W. [William] A. Haney, pastor of the Universalist Church, will officiate, and burial will be made in Fort Plain Cemetery.

Born in the Town of Danube, July 29, 1860, he was the son of George and Mary Suits Shaut. When a youth he lost his leg when he was injured in a railroad accident near St. Johnsville. While living in Fort Plain, he followed the occupation of caning chairs.

He was the last of his family, and the only survivors are nieces and nephews: Mrs. Margaret Briggs of Johnson City; Mrs. Rolland Dockey of St. Johnsville; Mrs. James [Gertrude] Coppernoll of Fort Plain, and Clinton Shaut of Albany.
