Obituary.

George Siddons, 75, died Saturday morning at 8:20 o'clock in his home, 49 Grove street, following an illness of three weeks' duration. He was taken sick with bronchitis and this developed into pneumonia. Mr. Siddons was born in Plattsburg, N. Y., being one of seven children, six boys and one girl, of Henry and Sarah (Sorrell) Siddons. For a number of years he carried on the farm adjoining the Cheney mansion place, so-called, on the west road to North Orange. Mrs. Siddons died 22 years ago. Mr. Siddons was a veteran of the Civil war, in which he saw four years of hard service. He enlisted in the 121st New York volunteer infantry at the age of 16. He was twice wounded. For the past several years he had made his home at 49 Grove street, Orange, though he had visited frequently at the home of his children out of town. He leaves five sons and four daughters as follows: Charles H., of Orange, George A., of Orleans, N. Y., Walter H., of Williamsville, Reginald A., of Athol, and Herbert L. Siddons of Orange, Mrs. Minnie J. Cole of New Salem, Mrs. Emogene Fullford of Greenfield, Mrs. Susie Foskett and Miss Lena M. Siddons of Orange. He also leaves two brothers, Abram and Levi Siddons of Norrisville, N. Y. The funeral was held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock in his late home, Rev. L. [Lewis] J. Richards [Universalist] officiating. Burial was in Central cemetery.
