DEATHS.

In Vienna, N.Y., on the 14th inst., Mr. CLINTON SISSON, youngest son of Hon. Isaac Sisson, aged 31 years. The deceased was an engineer on the New-York Central Railroad, and was killed in attempting to walk between his train, which was stationary on a switch, and a train that was passing under full headway, before daylight on the morning of the 14th inst. He was a young man of fine qualities of heart and mind. Through life he was upright in his principles, correct in his habits, exemplary in his deportment, and trustworthy in all the responsibilities which rested upon him. His residence was in Auburn, where he has left a wife [Ruth] and one child, with many relatives and friends, to mourn his sudden departure.—For many years he had been a member of the Universalist Society and choir in that place, and his respect for the religious principles he professed, and his desire to bring no discredit upon them by his conduct, will long be remembered with gratitude by the members of that Society. May the God of the widow and fatherless protect and bless his widow and little one, and reconcile them to the severe allotment which has befallen them. His funeral was attended in Auburn on the 16th inst., by a large and sympathizing audience, who in this manner attested their esteem for his virtuous and manly qualities.
