Miss Sue Sisson

Miss Sue Sisson, for forty years a resident of Cuba, died at the Kirkpatrick home Saturday morning after an illness of about two weeks, caused by anemia.

Susan Edwina Sisson was born in the vicinity of Friendship, Oct. 9, 1848, the daughter of Gideon and Mary E. Coates Sisson. She had always lived in the vicinity of Friendship, Black Creek and Cuba. In her earlier days she was a school teacher, but most of her years she had been given to the care of her parents and other members of her family. Her quiet life had been one of remarkable unselfishness and devotion: and her chief happiness had been in serving the aged and the children of her kin.

Miss Sisson was a member of the Universalist church of this place, and after it was closed continued to support the national body.

The funeral took place at the home of Mrs. Lawson Paul, Monday afternoon, conducted by the Rev. Robert Findlay. The bearers were nephews of the deceased: Edwin G. and William G. Sisson, of Olean; G. Ward Smalley, Belmont; Dr. Laurence B. Sisson, Auburn; Nathan Tucker, Belmont; Lawson Paul, Cuba.

Miss Sisson is survived by one brother, N. [Nelson] A. Sisson of Nile, two nieces, Mrs. Mae S. Paul and Miss Mildred Sisson of Cuba; the nephews above mentioned, also two others, Clifford Sisson of Nile and Clark Sisson of California.

Those from a distance at the funeral included the relatives mentioned, except the nephew residing in California, also Miss Lillian Hosley of Friendship.
