HORACE NEWBERRY SKINNER

Horace Newberry Skinner of 323 Macon street, the oldest stationer in New York City, died today at his residence, in his ninety-fifth year, from the aliments of old age. Potterton, will conduct his funeral services, probably on Thursday evening. The interment will be in Greenwood Cemetery. Mr. Skinner is survived by two sons, Norman H. and George, and two daughters, Miss Edith Skinner and Mrs. James McNeil of Flatbush.
