OBITUARY

Mrs. Josephine Skinner, widow of Henry A. Skinner, died Sunday afternoon at her home on East Main street following a paralytic stroke sustained last Wednesday. Prior to this attack she was in fairly good health. Deceased was born here February 21, 1848 and this city was always her home. Her father was Augustus Rofinot, who was born in Alsace-Lorraine. Her mother was Maria Harter Rofinot. On November 16, 1870, she was united in marriage to Henry A. The funeral will be held from St. Paul's Universalist Church at 2:30 on Wednesday afternoon. Rev. H. M. Cary, the pastor, will officiate, assisted by Rev. C. E. S. Rasay, rector of Emmanuel Episcopal church. Burial will be made in the family lot in the Church street cemetery.
