DEATH OF MRS. M. B. SLOAT  
Well Known and Popular Resident of Mount Vernon

Mrs. Lunitte T. Greenleaf Sloat, wife of Maitland B. Sloat, died at her late residence, 126 Wallace avenue, this morning. She had been seriously ill for two weeks, but had been in frail health for the last two months. Mrs. Sloat returned from a Brazilian trip two weeks ago where she and Mr. Sloat had been visiting their son.

She was born in La Fargeville, N. Y., the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Greenleaf. She was 81 years of age. Mrs. Sloat was a member of the D. A. R., of the Westchester Woman's club, and during the war she was actively engaged in Red Cross work. She was a member of the First Liberal church of Mount Vernon [a Universalist congregation], and of the Women's league connected with the church. Several months ago Mr. and Mrs. Sloat celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary in company with Mr. and Mrs. Henry J. Metz and Mr. and Mrs. Charles A. Breck. Mrs. Sloat was well known in Mount Vernon, where she had a large number of friends and acquaintances.

Besides her husband, Maitland R. Sloat, Mrs. Sloat is survived by two sons, Dr. Harrison G. Sloat, engaged in government service at Aspinwall, Pa., and Halbert M. Sloat, a resident of Rio De Janiero, Brazil.

The funeral services will be held from her late residence Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, and will be conducted by Rev. John Sayles, D. D., minister of the First Liberal church. The interment will be in Woodlawn cemetery.
