Mrs. Emily Smalley

Mrs. Emily Smalley, who has been an invalid for several years, died at the Memorial hospital in Cuba Tuesday afternoon, June 17, where she was taken Sunday, having suddenly suffered a relapse. She had been a patient at the hospital previously and recovered so that she was able to leave about ten days before her last seizure. The interval was passed at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Lawson Paul, and she appeared then to be much better than in a long period.

Emily Viola Sisson was born at Friendship, April 23, 1850, the daughter of Gideon and Mary E. Coates Sisson. On Aug. 1, 1870, she was married to Charles W. Smalley of Nile, who died in 1894. Mrs. Smalley's life was passed at Friendship, Nile, Cuba and Belmont. She had lived in Cuba some thirty years and during this time endeared herself to many friends by her refined and gentle bearing. Since her illness part of her time had been spent at Belmont in the home of her son Ward.

Mrs. Smalley was from her early years a member of the Universalist church, but while in Cuba attended the Presbyterian church. She was also a member of Eastern Star.

The deceased is survived by a daughter Mae, Mrs. Lawson Paul, of Cuba, and a son, G. Ward Smalley of Belmont; also two grandchildren, Mrs. Nathan Tucker of Belmont and Miss Elizabeth Paul of Cuba, and a great-grandchild, Nathan Tucker, jr.; also a sister, Miss Sue Sisson of Cuba, and a brother, Adolphus Sisson of Nile.

The funeral was held yesterday afternoon at the Paul residence on West Main street, conducted by the Rev. Robert Findlay, with interment at Friendship.
