Death of Albert L. Smith

Albert L. Smith of No. 98 North Division street died at his home Saturday afternoon at 4:30 after an illness extending over the past five years. He was born in Waterloo, was an honorably discharged fireman of the Waterloo department and at one time was deputy sheriff of Seneca county. He was appointed a guard at Auburn prison July 6, 1887 and later became a patrolman of the city of Auburn. Subsequently he returned to the prison as a guard and was employed there until about five years ago when illness compelled him to retire.
