JUDSON SMITH Death Removes Esteemed Resident of Madison County.

Solsville, March 2.—The death of Judson Smith, which occurred at his home here yesterday, removed one of the best known residents of the vicinity. He was born at Bouckville 72 years ago and for a long time lived on a farm between Morrisville and Peterboro. His parents were Joseph and Eliza Cook Smith. For 25 years Mr. Smith had lived in Solsville and had bought hops and wool for W. H. Fitchard of Utica and an Oneonta firm. In his business of wool and hop buying he was an authority. Mr. Smith was a man of [a] very kindly disposition, quiet and retiring, but possessed ability and qualities that made him esteemed by all. He was, when able, an attendant of the Universalist church of this village. Mr. Smith's death is (mourned?) by all who knew him. He is survived by his wife [Elizabeth], several sons and a daughter, a brother, Myrtle of Knoxboro, and a sister, Mrs. Wise of Westmoreland, and a sister in Iowa. The funeral will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. at the Universalist Church in this village and the body will be placed in the vault until spring when burial will be made in Utica.
