Lyndon Smith Dies in N. J.; Rites Friday

Lyndon E. Smith, 55, of 309 Lakeside Ave., Pompton Lakes, N.J., a former Fort Plain resident, died Tuesday morning at the Lakeview Convalescent Center in Wayne, N. J., after a lengthy illness.
