Death Is Sudden Heart Attack Proves Fatal To Mrs. Smith Wife of Typewriter Co. President Stricken at Theater

Stricken with a heart attack soon after entering the lobby of a downtown theater, Mrs. Hurlbut W. Smith of 1111 James Street, wife of the president of L. C. Smith & Corona Typewriters, Inc., died about 7:30 o'clock Wednesday night.

Mrs. Smith was stricken in the lobby and an ambulance was called. She died before reaching her home. Death was caused by coronary thrombosis.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith, the latter apparently in good health, attended an early program. A few minutes after entering the theater Mrs. Smith collapsed.

Formerly Miss Mina Ruma Glazier, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John G. Glazier, Mrs. Smith was born in Syracuse more than 60 years ago. She attended Seymour grade school and the old Syracuse High School. Mr. and Mrs. Smith were married Oct. 16, 1889.

She was a member of Betts Memorial Universalist Church and auxiliaries of University Hospital, Onondaga Orphans Home, Day Nursery and the Visiting Nurse Association, Order of the Eastern Star, Morning Musicals and the Y. W. C. A.

Mrs. Smith is survived by her husband and six cousins, Mrs. Harry A. Dunsmoor, Mrs. Russell T. Bull, Mrs. Floyd Adams, Allen P. Doane, Flode Doane and Eleanor Doane.

Funeral services will be held at the Smith home at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon with the Rev. Ellsworth C. Reamon officiating. Burial will be in Oakwood Cemetery.
