After having passed the allotted span of life by eleven years, death claimed Mrs. Sarah Snow, a lifelong resident of Whitesville and vicinity, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Alice McGraw at Canisteo, Saturday morning, Jan. 22, where for the past three or four years she had made her home.

Mrs. Snow had been afflicted with heart trouble for a number of years but had enjoyed fairly good health otherwise up to a few days before her death. [On] Saturday morning she called Mrs. McGraw about 7 o'clock saying she felt ill. Everything possible was done for her but at 8 o'clock she was dead.

Deceased was born at Westfield, N.Y., April 20, 1856[.] [A]t Shongo she was married to Warren B. Snow who died several years ago. To them were born six children all of whom survive.
