RETIRED TEACHER IS DEAD AT 70

Canton — Miss Lottie Emily Southworth, a retired teacher, died late Thursday night (Apr. 6, 1961) at her home, 54 Park St., after a long illness. Her age was 70.

The body is resting at the Lawrence funeral home where the funeral will be Sunday at 2 p.m., with the Rev. Max Coots, pastor of the Universalist Church of Canton, officiating. Interment will be in Evergreen cemetery.

Friends may call at the funeral home Saturday from 3 to 5 p.m. and from 7 to 9 p.m.

Only survivors are four cousins, the Misses Irene and Eva Southworth of this village, Orville Southworth of Los Angeles, Calif., and Mrs. Edward (Alice) Bush of Brushton.

Miss Southworth was born in Canton, June 6, 1890, the daughter of the late Tracy P. and Nellie Mead Southworth. She was graduated from Canton High School and in 1914 from St. Lawrence University. In 1918, she was graduated from the State Agricultural school, Canton, where she majored in home economics. Later, she did graduate work in home economics at Columbia University and at Cornell University. She taught in Canton and Colton high schools before joining the faculty of the Canton A. T. I., where she taught in the home economics department for many years, retiring in 1945.

While at St. Lawrence University, Miss Southworth was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma social sorority. She was a member of the Universalist Church of Canton, and for many years was a trustee of the Canton Free Library.
