Carl E. Spaulding Service Held Here

Funeral services were held here on Sunday afternoon at the R. B. Lawrence Funeral home and comittal service at the Fairview cemetery on Monday for Carl E. Spaulding, 59, who died Wednesday night, November 22, at a Long Island hospital following an illness of about three weeks. His death was attributed to a heart condition. Dr. Edson R. Miles [Universalist] conducted the services here. Another service was held at Queens Village, L. I. on Friday before the body was sent here for burial.

Mr. Spaulding was born in the village of Canton, July 17, 1891 during the time his father had returned to school at St. Lawrence university after several years of teaching following his graduation from Potsdam normal. Carl E. was the son of Frank B. and Bettie (Felton?) Spaulding.

Descendant of the Spaulding family who settled on the Spaulding farm at Langdon Corners, Carl E. Spaulding retained ownership of the farm and returned to Canton each summer with his family to spend his vacation and to look after the affairs of the farm which is now rented.

After completing his studies at St. Lawrence university Frank B. Spaulding moved his family to Brooklyn where he became principal in the Brooklyn public school system. Carl E. Spaulding attended schools there and later studied at Union college.

He served in the first World War and had attained the rank of first lieutenant at the time of his discharge. In 1918, he married the former Miss Edith Thien. For the past 15 years he has been associated with the Krug Baking company of New York in the personnel department.

Surviving Mr. Spaulding are his wife, a daughter Catherine of New York City, and a son, Frank of Queen's Village, a sister, Mrs. Charles Bradbury of Connecticut, and several cousins in this area including, in Canton, Mrs. Addie Gray and H. Clarence Mead.
