Mrs. Eugenia Spencer

A woman whose influence will always leave a deep impression on all who knew her, passed from this life last Wednesday when Mrs. Eugenia Tupper Spencer, wife of Oscar W. Spencer, died at the family home on the Old Dekalb road. Mrs. Spencer had been in very poor health for many weeks and the end was not unexpected. The funeral was held from the home Saturday afternoon, Dr. J. M. Payson officiating. Burial was made in the East Dekalb cemetery.

Mrs. Spencer was born in the farm where she died in December, 1866, a daughter of Daniel and Emma Kelly Tupper. All of her life had been spent there with the exception of a few years passed in Dekalb Junction. In her early life she was a school teacher and was the first primary teacher in the Dekalb Junction Union School. She was a member of the Canton Universalist church, the Eddy Charity Club, the W.C.T.U. and the D.A.R. She married Oscar W. Spencer, who survives, on August 8, 1900.

Besides her husband she is survived by a son, Dr. Dan T. Spencer, a dentist of Canton, and her stepmother, Mrs. Ora Tupper, of Dekalb Junction.
