Obituary.

Died, at his residence at North Hector, April 17th, 1881, Mr. Theodore Squires, in the sixty-first year of his age, after an illness of several months, with no alarming symptoms until a few days before his death.

The deceased had been a continuous resident of North Hector about forty years. In early life he was engaged largely in mercantile business, and buying and shipping produce, under the firm name of Squires & Wilcox—of late years alone, in buying of produce. His large and extensive business transactions made a wide acquaintance with people in Schuyler and Seneca counties.—Mr. Squires was a very careful business man, always had day and dates to refer to in any business transaction.

In religious belief he was a Universalist, dying peacefully and quietly in that faith. He was firm and decided in his religious opinions; but would never urge or press his views on others. He leaves a wife, a son and daughter to mourn the loss of a kind husband and devoted father to the best interest of his children, a kind and obliging neighbor, and a wise counsellor in business transactions. His death is a loss to the whole neighborhood.
