DEATHS.

In Marshall, April 29th, WILLIAM G., son of Dr. Consider H. and Polly [née Bass] Stacy, aged 16 months—and on September 20, Dr. CONSIDER H. STACY, whose death was noticed in this paper at the time [on 23 Oct 1840]—and on October 12th, SETH B. STACY, son of Dr. Stacy, dec'd., aged 20 years, lacking 5 days. He died of consumption, after much and severe suffering, which he endured with submission and patience. He seemed to desire to live, only that he might comfort and support his widowed mother, and rear and educate his younger brothers and sisters. By these repeated bereavements sister Stacy was deprived of a tender infant—then of a most affectionate and estimable husband, and last of a son on whom she hoped to lean in the decline of her life—the only remaining stay of the family. But thanks be to our heavenly Father she can say in the full confidence of her glorious faith—"It is the Lord—he has done it—*he doeth all things well.*
