MRS. NELLIE A. STAINTON

Mrs. Nellie Abbott Stainton passed away in the Community hospital, Warsaw, Monday evening, Dec. 5, aged 56 years. She had been in poor health for several months, suffering from high blood pressure and a heart ailment. About three weeks ago she suffered a severe shock [stroke] in her home, 37 St. Helena street and had been a patient in the hospital since then. [On] Monday, November 28, she suffered another shock from which she never regained consciousness.

Nellie May Abbott was born on the Abbott homestead, where her brother Ray now resides, on March 23, 1882, only daughter of Elmer and Ellen Lake Abbott. She was educated in the Perry high school. Evinced a decided talent for music in early life she continued her education in this art, studying under Mrs. J.G. Howland and Miss Laura Page and later took advanced study at Eastman School of Music.

She had always given freely of her talents for the enjoyment of others and had conducted large classes for piano students in Perry and Silver Springs. Mrs. Stainton was a member of the Universalist church, and the Friendship Circle of that Church.

For the past twelve years she had lived at the home on St. Helena street where she cared for her mother and father before their passing.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Arthur Rogers and two brothers, Fred E. and Ray H., both of Perry. The funeral will be held at 59 Lake St. tomorrow afternoon at 1 o'clock, Rev. Julia Tobey of the Universalist Church will officiate and burial will be in Glenwood cemetery.
