Death of E. G. Stanard

Edwin G. Stanard, a well known resident of Le Roy, died at 11 o'clock on Friday at his home on Clay street. For the past two or three years his health had been steadily failing and he continued to grow weaker until the end came, although he was not confined to his bed only about one week.

The deceased was born in the town of Pavilion on the old Stanard homestead near Bailey's Mills, and was a son of the late Roswell Stanard. On Oct. 5, 1848, he was united in marriage to Miss Eunice Kendall, who survives him. After his marriage, Mr. Stanard removed to Bethany, where he resided upon a farm for several years and then went to Batavia, where he engaged in mercantile business for a time. He spent a few years in Sparta, Mich., and finally returned to Le Roy. For several years he traveled through this State selling salt for the Gainlock Salt. Co of Warsaw, continuing in the capacity of salesman until failing health caused him to retire from active life.

Mr. Stanard was a member of the Universalist church in this village and was always a faithful attendant at the services as long as health permitted. Besides his wife he is survived by one sister, Mrs. H. A. Smead, of Buffalo.

The funeral, which was private, was held at his late home on Sunday afternoon, Rev. E. L. Conklin officiating, and the remains were taken to the cemetery at Bailey's Mills for burial.
