Heydon Starrett, Physician, Dead

Dr. Heydon Starrett, well-known Brooklyn physician, died yesterday at his home, 100-32 Stratford St., Forest Hills, after a long illness. He was 75.

Dr. Starrett was graduated from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University in 1880 and his internship was in Bellevue Hospital. His general practice was in New York and Brooklyn for 52 years. He came to Brooklyn in 1891 and was a police surgeon in the Police Department of the old city of Brooklyn.

Dr. Starrett was a 32nd degree Mason; past master of Sterling Lodge, F. & A.M.; past grand representative of the Grand Lodge of San Salvador; past commander of Damascus Commandery, Knights Templars.; past president of the Past Masters' Club of Brooklyn; member of Orient Chapter of the Royal Arch Masons, the Brooklyn Council, the Scottish Rite Masons and the Kismet Temple.

He is survived by his wife, Emma; two sons, Kemp and Milford; a sister, Mrs. Nellie Payne, and two brothers, Louis S. Starrett and James Albert Starrett.

Services will be held Friday evening at the Universalist Church of the Good Tidings, Stuyvesant Ave. and Madison St. Burial will be from the church at 11 a.m. Saturday, with interment at Greenwood Cemetery.
