ELLERY STEBBINS Death of Former Business Man Occurred After Long Illness

Clinton, April 25—The death of Ellery Stebbins occurred after an extended illness. Ellery Stebbins was born on Utica street, Clinton May 15, 1844. He was educated in the Holbrook Academy, later known as the Liberal Institute, and as a young man graduated from East__? Business College at Poughkeepsie. He established a general store on East Park Row, Clinton, which he conducted successfully for 40 years and sold it in 1908, when he retired. Since then he had done some business in insurance. Mr. Stebbins was also at one time in business in Utica. He was a partner of Consider G. Mitchell and the firm of Mitchell, Stebbins & Co. did an extensive wholesale business in dry goods and notions in the [?] Block on John street. He continued in this firm for five or six years.

Mr. Stebbins had traveled [considerably?] in [?] and has spent his winters in Havana, Cuba. He was one of the earliest members of the Commercial Travelers Mutual Accident Association of America, the number of his membership being less than 400. At one time he was a member of the Anglers Association of Syracuse. He joined the Fort Schuyler Club of Utica soon after it was organized and remained a member three or four years. He took an active interest in the affairs of the village of Clinton and for many years was one of its trustees. He was a member of the Clinton Board of Trade and had served on the Sewer Board. He attended the Universalist Church. Mr. Stebbins was a man who deserved the high esteem in which he was held. He married Miss Alice P. Allerton of Mount Vernon, who is living. He leaves two children, Allen A. of Boston, Mass., who is superintendent of the Boston & [?] Railroad, and Julia A., wife of Dr. J. N. Garlinghouse of Clinton. He leaves also a sister, Mrs. George W. Casler, of Denver, Col.
